Audacity Transcriptions

Intel has made a plug-in for Audacity that will do transcriptions locally on your computer. (Read the Audacity blog post, "Introducing OpenVINO AI effects for Audacity.")

You can read the <u>Openvino Plugins Instructions</u> if you want to. Basically, installation involves copying and pasting Intel's files into C:\Program Files\Audacity, enabling the plugin, and restarting Audacity.

When setting the "OpenVINO Inference Device," you'll need to do testing on your own machine to see if your computer's GPU or CPU is better equipped for the task. Sometimes one is better than the other, depending on the machine.

Transcription Process

Here's the gist of the transcription process:

1. **Run** the plugin (Analyze > OpenVINO Whisper Transcription). The plugin will create a Label Track in Audacity and enter the transcription there:



2. **Export** the Label Tracks (File > Export Other > Export Labels) into a text document:

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3. To convert this to paragraph form, **copy-paste** the text into Excel. Since the different columns are separated by tabs, it separates the text like so:

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Copy-paste Column C into Word. *Make sure to paste as plain text. If you don't, the next step won't work.*

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4. Finally, use **find-and-replace** (searching for the special character "^p") to remove all the hard returns, putting the entire document into a single paragraph form:
